

The Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP) is an independent, non-profit-making research and training institute, established in Athens in 1988. Over the years it has developed into one of the most respected and influential think-tanks in Greece, focusing on the study of a wide and highly diversified range of issues relating to some of the biggest challenges faced today by Greece, Europe and the world.

The Foundation's work is guided by the principles of scientific research, critical thinking and the free exchange of views and ideas, and aims at developing scientifically substantiated, policy-oriented responses to issues dominating the national and international public debate.



Its main activities include conducting scientific research, providing information and training opportunities to various groups of professionals, and promoting an informed public dialogue through awareness-raising initiatives, such as lectures and discussions, publications and online consultations. The Foundation also has a strong international presence, as it participates in important transnational networks and has

developed partnerships with well-known institutions from Greece and abroad.

ELIAMEP's work is funded principally through grants awarded to it in support of specific research, training and/or awareness-raising projects, as well as the provision of research and training services to public and private institutions, both in Greece and abroad.

The Foundation is governed by a 13-member Board of Directors and a 10-member Honorary Council, which consist of prominent personalities from the fields of academia, politics, media, business and the military. It is staffed by a large number of research fellows, associates and interns, usually affiliated with it on the basis of specific projects, as well as a smaller number of permanent employees, who deal with the Foundation's day-to-day running and management.

2011 has been yet another very difficult year both for Greece and the European Union and think-tanks with a clear European orientation like ELIAMEP cannot but be affected at various levels. In periods of crisis of political and economic governance for the Union and of increasing Euro-skepticism in member-states, the challenge for strong believers in the European project is to facilitate a public debate about Europe's future and to offer solutions to existing problems. Securing the necessary funding, exclusively from the private sector, continues to be a very challenging and time-demanding effort but we are optimistic that we will continue to function at the desired level.

Although the Greek and European crises remained at the centre of our activities, in terms of policy studies and public outreach activities, we were active in our traditional fields of interest, such as Greek foreign and security policy, migration, minorities and human rights. In 2011 we tried to strengthen and expand our institutional capacity and activities in the field of regional developments (especially Southeastern Europe and the Middle East) and energy (with an exclusive focus on the geopolitical dimension of hydrocarbons and pipelines in Southeastern Europe and the Eastern Mediterranean). This effort will continue in 2012. A steady stream of books, policy papers and briefing notes were published in 2011, in addition to the four issues of the Journal of Southeast European and Black Sea Studies and we are planning a slight increase in the number of our publications for 2012.

Priority areas for research and activities will continue to include the consequences of Arab revolts for the region itself and for Europe, migration and developments in Turkey and the Balkans. We will try to promote meetings and exchange of visits with our respective counterparts in several countries, including Germany, China, Russia, the United States and Israel. Finally, it will remain our standard policy to seek promoting institutional cooperation in our neighborhood through the strengthening of networks.

Research

European Integration

Institutional developments and prospects of the EU

ELIAMEP's research work in this field focuses on institutional and political developments in the EU and in particular on the challenges posed by the rejection of the Constitutional Treaty and the implications of the revised Treaty of Lisbon. More recent research has explored the prospects of alternative forms of differentiated integration as well as the challenges and opportunities of further politicization of the EU. In this context, the European Seminars fall within the Foundation's broader mission to enhance policy-thinking about the prospects of European integration. Furthermore, ELIAMEP participates in the "Think Global Act European" project and was also actively involved in a project together with the Policy Network and the European Institute of the LSE in the project entitled "An EU 'fit for purpose' in a global age."

EU enlargement and external policy

Enlargement and the integration of southeast Europe in the Union is among ELIAMEP's priority research areas. The EU's neighbourhood policy as a comprehensive and inclusive strategy has also been at the centre of the Foundation's research work. ELIAMEP coordinated the <u>IBEU research project</u> which focused on the changing nature of borders in the Balkans and their EU membership perspective. Specific activities covering the wider field of external policy also include work on peacebuilding and development cooperation, as well as common foreign, security and defence policy.



Sectoral policies of the EU

Currently, ELIAMEP participates in the project <u>IME - European and national identity construction programmes</u> <u>and politics, culture, history and religion</u> which investigates the diversity and commonalities among European identities in different European countries.

ELIAMEP also coordinates MEDIADEM, a European research project which seeks to understand and explain the factors that promote or conversely hinder the development of policies supporting free and independent media. The project investigates media policy-making processes in 14 European countries, placing them in their proper socio-political context, and examines the opportunities and challenges posed by new media services for media freedom and independence.

Further work is being undertaken to encourage reflection on the political economy of Europe, particularly the economic management of the EU and the social regulation of economic relations in the EU. In this context, ELIAMEP has participated in two research-oriented networks of excellence, EU CONSENT- Wider Europe, Deeper Integration and RECWOWE - Reconciling Work and Welfare. The Foundation also participates in the activities of EPIN Network with 30 members in 26 countries focusing on current EU and European political and policy debates. Moreover, the Foundation has coordinated research projects concentrating on the processes of human rights litigation in the ECHR (JURISTRAS); and on the effects of European integration on EU territorial minorities (EUROREG). Past projects have focused on the importance of national political cultures in the functioning of the EU (The Political Culture(s) of Europe) and on the evolution and role of media in a European public sphere (EMEDIATE). In addition, ELIAMEP has engaged in a number of initiatives aiming at promoting public discussion on European issues ("Communicating EU values across Greece") and has completed an empirical research study on Higher education in Greece.

Irregular Migration

ELIAMEP's migration research team has concluded a study on the <u>Treatment of Irregular Migrants at the EU External Borders</u> coordinated by Thanos Maroukis with the participation of Michaela Maroufof, Kleopatra Youssef, Angeliki Dimitriadi, Despoina Syrri and Marina Nikolova. The project is funded by the <u>Fundamental Rights Agency</u> (FRA) and the ELIAMEP team has conducted the case studies on the Greek Turkish sea and land borders, Cyprus and the Bulgarian Turkish land border. The relevant reports will be published in late 2012 by the FRA.

Triandafyllidou, A. and Maroukis, T. (2011) <u>Migrant Smuggling. Irregular Migration from Asia and Africa to Europe</u>, London: Palgrave

This book surveys the phenomenon of migrant smuggling across the Mediterranean. It looks at the routes of irregular migration from sub-Saharan Africa to Spain and Italy. It meticulously analyses the phenomenon of migrant smuggling with a focus on the routes that lead from Africa and Asia via Turkey to Greece. The book questions to what extent migrant smuggling is a business or indeed a social process enmeshed in origin and transit countries' social networks.

Integration and Multiculturalism

The ELIAMEP team has started in April 2011 a project on the integration of intra EU migrants into their places of destination. The MOVEACT project compares the processes of social and political integration of leisuremovers (e.g. Germans or Brits moving to southern Europe for life style reasons) vs. economic migrants (e.g. Romanians and Bulgarians migrating to find better life and employment prospects). MOVEACT has released its first publications. The project's plans include dissemination events in the four participating countries which will be held in late 2012.

Security and Regional Developments

Based on the premise that national, regional and international security are closely connected, this research area covers a wide range of geographic and thematic topics. Greek foreign and security policy and Greece's role in the European security architecture and the Mediterranean are priorities at the centre of this research cluster. The Cyprus issue and Greek-Turkish relations in view of Turkey's EU vocation and the consequent changes in its society, politics and foreign policy constitute the fundamental pillars of this research area.

Furthermore, ELIAMEP explores a number of thematic and functional issues. Good governance, energy security, and asymmetric threats, such as international terrorism, the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, or transnational criminal networks, are studied in terms of the new challenges these pose for the security sector.

At the same time, ELIAMEP's projects address political and security developments as well as regional cooperation in Southeastern Europe, the future of the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership (EMP), and other initiatives, such as the new European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP), NATO's Mediterranean Dialogue (MD) and the Istanbul Cooperation Initiative (ICI) as well as the Black Sea Economic Cooperation (BSEC). Activities include expert meetings, workshops and conferences, conflict resolution and training seminars, working and policy papers and cooperation among networks of institutes.

Journal of Southeast European and Black Sea Studies

Currently in its twelfth year of publication, the *Journal of Southeast European and Black Sea Studies* has established itself as a core academic reference for the regions of the Black Sea and Southeast Europe. The impact of the global financial crisis in the Balkans, the process of European integration in Turkey, the political and cultural role of Islam in SE Europe, the energy and immigration strategies in the region were some of the issues explored in the Journal this year.

Moreover, two Special Issues were published, offering a special insight on the broader topic of security in SE Europe and the Black Sea. Sinikukka Saari edited a Special Issue on "Managing Distrust in the Wider Black Sea Region" (Vol.11:3, September 2011) which deals with the issues of security and trust-build in the wider Black Sea Region including an assessment of the impact of EU involvement and Russian policy in the area. Nikolaos Tzifakis and Asteris Huliaras edited a Special Issue entitled "Human Security in the Balkans" (Vol. 11: 4, December 2011) offering a whole-rounded contextual approach on the major issue of human security. The issue focuses on the Balkan region tackling among others the questions of poverty and human security, the


geography of nationalisms in the pre-Communist Balkan space as well as the environmental and migration policies as a complex nexus in the broader region.

All articles published in the JSEEBSS undergo rigorous peer-review, and the Journal is included in the ISI Social Science Citation Index since 2007. According to Thomson Reuters, 2010 Journal Citation Reports, the Journal of Southeast European and Black Sea Studies has been ranked 15th out of 60 journals in the category Area Studies.







Year after year, ELIAMEP's presence in the Greek and foreign media grows, serving one of the Foundation's main objectives which is to raise public awareness and provide valid analysis on issues related to European policy and international affairs. In 2011, its academic staff, research fellows and associates had a dynamic presence in the media with articles, interviews and quotations in newspapers, journals, radio and television stations from all around the world.

Articles written by ELIAMEP researchers and associates were published in well-known, widely circulated Greek newspapers, such as *Kathimerini*, *Ta Nea*, *Ethnos*, *To Vima*, but also in foreign press and magazines, as *The New York Times*, *International Tribune*, *Le Temps*, *Le Monde*, *Foreign Affairs* etc.

Furthermore, in response to current important internal and international issues, such as the economic crisis, the political and social situation of Greece, irregular migration, European policy, the developments in Middle East and other international political issues, ELIAMEP representatives gave interviews to Greek and foreign television and radio stations and printed media. Among other, these included *The New York Times, BBC, Reuters, Bloomberg News, The Washington Post*, the newspaper *Independent*, the German public TV channel *ARD, Al Jazeera Television, France 24, El Pais, Le Figaro, 24 Heures, Le Temps, Huffington Post*, the German *BILD, Die Welt, Tagesspiegel*, the Public German Radio *SWR*, the *Lusa News Agency* and *TVI* of Portugal, the Russian *RIA Novosti*, the National Swiss Radio, the Swiss daily *Neue Zürcher Zeitung*, the Dutch national newspaper *Trouw*, the Swedish *Sveriges Radio*, the Danish daily newspaper *Dagbladet Information*, the Bulgarian newspaper *Capital Weekly, Utrinski Vesnik* (FYROM), the Serbian *NRC Handelsblad*, the Croatian magazine *Globus*, the Hungarian daily newspaper *Népszabadság*, the Polish radio station *TOK FM*, the United Daily News Group of Taiwan, the Australian TV channel *SBS Dateline*, the national radio *ABC* and the *Australian Financial Review*, the Iranian public TV channel *IRINN*, the Latvian Radio, *China Central TV Europe*, the Korean newspaper *Kookmin-ilbo* and the Korean Press Agency.

In conclusion, ELIAMEP proved to be an independent and reliable reference point for journalists with regard to matters of national, European and global interest, gaining wide recognition in Greece and beyond its borders.







In 2011 ELIAMEP continued its effort to further expand its web-presence. In particular, the Foundation's main website reinforced its role as a central channel of communication for disseminating information on a daily basis about our activities, publications, events and initiatives. Inter alia, special emphasis was given to the presence of ELIAMEP representatives in domestic and international media. The website also offered a special link where material related to the Greek crisis can be found and easily accessed while micro-websites on programmes such as Europe Direct, Mediadem and Transition to Green Greece, complemented its role as a central channel. Furthermore, attention was paid to the regular upload of videos based on interviews with academics and policy-makers all over the world.

Through the usage of social media, mainly blip.tv, facebook and twitter, our Foundation managed to significantly improve its network.

Finally, ELIAMEP continued to develop its content partnerships with the renowned European information portals EURACTIV and TOUTELEUROPE while it gave the opportunity to resident and guest scholars to publish opinion pieces in its blogosphere.





Loukas Tsoukalis, President of the Board of Directors

Loukas Tsoukalis was a speaker at the seminar 'Crisis in the euro area, the economic and monetary union and future of the EU', organized by the Economic Development Foundation, based in Istanbul, on 25 January. On 10 February he delivered a lecture in the Faculty of Laws of the University College London. He spoke in the international conference on the future of Europe, organized by Policy Network, in partnership with the European Commission's UK Representation. He also spoke at the conference 'Democracy, Constitution and European Sympolity', organized by the Centre for European Constitutional Law (CECL) in Athens, on 17-18 February 2011. On 1 March he participated in a roundtable discussion 'The crisis in Greece: the scientists' perspective', organized by the Bodossaki Foundation and Megaron Plus. He was the main speaker of the event 'What could be the future of Greece in a rapidly changing world', organized by the Corfu Reading Society and the Bodossaki Foundation, in Corfu on 11 March. He delivered a speech on 'What Europe should we envisage following the economic crisis?' in the framework of the Economist Conference "The Fourth Cyprus Summit: Leadership Strategy for Cyprus's Unity and Prosperity", held in Nicosia on 17-18 March. On 12-13 May, he participated in the Progressive Governance Summit, held in Oslo, with the participation of heads of state and government, and chaired the final session 'Social democracy beyond the nation-state; do we have a distinctive international agenda?'. On 16 May he spoke at the event 'Greece and Europe: The great contradiction', organized by the Foundation for Economic and Industrial Research (IOBE), in Athens. On 24 May he took part in a roundtable discussion on 'Greece in the European Union for thirty years: Assessment and Perspectives' in Geneva. He spoke in the international conference entitled 'Whose crisis? Greece's politics, economy and society in an era of uncertainty', organized by the South East European Studies at Oxford University on 26-28 May. On 31 May, he was one of the speakers in the event organized by ELIAMEP and EPC in Brussels, entitled 'What kind of EU after the crisis?', which coincided with the publication of the book The Delphic Oracle on Europe - Is there a Future for the European Union? (OUP), which he co-edited with Janis A. Emmanouilidis. On 1 June, he was the main speaker of the event 'Beyond the economic crisis: EU and Greece', organized by the European Parliament Office in Cyprus and OPEC, in Nicosia. On 8-10 September he participated in the first SERBIA - EU FORUM in Belgrade on 'Overcoming the crisis, moving towards the European Union', discussing EU policy towards the Western Balkans. On 13-14 September he presented his paper 'Greece in the euro area: Odd man out, or precursor of things to come?' during the conference 'Resolving the European Debt Crisis', hosted by the Peterson Institute for International Economics and Bruegel in Paris. On 28 September he delivered the Annual Review Lecture of the Journal of Common Market Studies, at King's College, London. On 5 October he was a speaker at the seminar 'What future for internationalism in 21st century social democracy?', held in Brussels and organized by Policy Network in partnership with the think tank of the Dutch Labour party, Wiardi Beckman Stichting, and the Foundation for European Progressive Studies (FEPS). On 9 November he presented his paper 'The Political Economy of the Crisis: The End of an Era?' in the framework of the Dahrendorf Symposium, held in Berlin. He also spoke about the politics of the euro crisis in the ECFR Council Meeting on 'The Reinvention of Europe: How to stop Europe falling apart', held in Warsaw on 10 November. On 23 November he spoke at a Bruegel seminar on 'A Growth Agenda for Greece' held in Brussels.



On 5 December he delivered a speech on 'Our national crisis: is there an exit?' in an event organized by Navarino Network in Thessaloniki.

Thanos Dokos, Director General

In February 2011 Dr. Thanos Dokos, ELIAMEP's director-general, chaired a workshop on migration and homeland security at the Hellenic National Security Academy and organized an international conference on climate change and the impact on the Mediterranean region. In March he was a speaker at a meeting of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly on NATO's role in the Mediterranean and the Middle East and participated to the 2011 Brussels Forum, organized by the German Marshall Fund. In April he presented a paper at a workshop organized by IAI, in Rome, on Southern European policies towards the Mediterranean, spoke at the 2011 EXPOSEC conference in Athens and chaired a round-table discussion on the issue of Greece's Exclusive Economic Zone, organized by ELIAMEP in Athens. He also visited Iran for a series of lectures and meetings with think-tanks. In May he was a speaker at a conference organized by the Foreign Ministries of Greece and the Russian Federation in Athens on issues of European security. He also chaired a session at the Kyiv Security Forum and participated to the First consultative meeting of the EU Non-Proliferation Consortium ("Kick-off Meeting") in Brussels. In June he was a speaker at a workshop a Nuclear-Weapons Free Zone in the Middle East organized by the EU-ISS in Paris. In July he participated to the annual plenary meeting of the Arab Reform Initiative in Cairo and to a Middle East meeting organized in Athens by the University of California.

In September he was a speaker at the Belgrade Security Forum and in October he participated to a workshop on European policies in the context of the Arab revolts and the role of European thinks-tanks, organized by the EU-ISS in Brussels. Later in the month he was a speaker at GMF's Mediterranean Strategy Program meeting in Barcelona and to a conference on defence policy and defence industry in Thessaloniki. In November he participated to the annual EU-ISS conference on the Arab democratic wave that was held in Paris. He lectured on Middle Eastern Developments at the Fall School organized in Athens in cooperation with the Free University of Berlin, to the European University of Cyprus on the Cyprus problem, and at a workshop organized in Athens by the student association SAFIA on the 10th anniversary of 9/11. In December he lectured on climate change and its impact of national security at the Greek Military Academy. He also spoke on the need for a homeland security doctrine at the annual conference of Greek Police officers. During the year, he also participated in three meetings of the Greek-Turkish Forum in Athens, Istanbul and Nicosia.

He wrote four policy papers, two of which were published by ELIAMEP on the basic outline of a homeland security doctrine and the rising tension in the quadrangle Greece-Cyprus-Israel-Turkey as a result of hydrocarbon exploration in the Eastern Mediterranean. A paper on Greece's policy vis-a-vis the Mediterranean in the transatlantic context was published by IAI and another on the Eastern Mediterranean and the Persian Gulf in 2020 was published by the GMF.

Dia Anagnostou, Senior Research Fellow

In 2011, Dia Anagnostou, Senior Research Fellow of ELIAMEP, was a Marie Curie Fellow at the Department of Law at the European University Institute, to work on a book entitled *A European-wide 'rights revolution' — Migrants and minorities in the Strasbourg Court*. In April 2011, Anagnostou taught a course at the University of Siena MA Program on Human Rights and Genocide Studies, in the frame of the module "The universality of human rights." In June 2011, she organized a workshop on "Law, Rights and Social Mobilization in the Multilevel European System", which was funded by and hosted at the International Institute for the Sociology

of Law, Onati (Basque Country), on 16-17 June 2011. In this workshop, she also presented her paper "Does EU promote gender equality at the national level? Feminist mobilization, counter-mobilization and policy change in Greece". Subsequently, Anagnostou presented a paper entitled "From Belfast to Diyarbakir: Minorities under State of Emergency, Civil Society and the Expansion of European Human Rights Law", at the 6th European Consortium of Political Research General Conference, in the panel on "Courts and the policy process", which took place at the University of Iceland in August 2011. In October of the same year, Anagnostou participated at the seminar on "Bridging the implementation gap - Enlarging Civil Society's Role in the European Court of Human Rights' Implementation Process" organized by the Netherlands Helsinki Committee in the Hague, where she presented her research findings on the domestic implementation of the ECtHR's judgments. Her paper on "Citizenship Policy-Making in Mediterranean States: Greece", was published at the EUDO Citizenship Observatory, Robert Schuman Centre, EUI, in May 2011 (accessed at http://eudocitizenship.eu/docs/EUDOComp-Greece.pdf).

Anna Triandafyllidou, Senior Research Fellow

Anna Triandafyllidou published an edited volume together with Tariq Modood and Nasar Meer on 'European Multiculturalisms' with Edinburgh University Press, and co-edited with Dita Vogel and Franck Duvella Themed Issue on Irregular Migration from a European Perspective, in the peer refereed journal International Migration. During 2011, Prof. Triandafyllidou also published four journal articles in peer-refereed Anglophone journals: (with M. Ambrosini) 'Irregular Immigration Control in Italy and Greece: Strong fencing and weak gate-keeping serving the labour market, European Journal of Migration and Law; with D. Vogel and F. Duvell, 'Irregular Migration from a European Perspective: An Introduction', International Migration; with Ruby Gropas, 'Migrants and Political Life in Greece: Between Political Patronage and the Search for Inclusion', South European Society and Politics, and again with Ruby Gropas, 'Greek Education Policy and the Challenge of Migration: An "Intercultural" View of Assimilation', Race, Ethnicity and Education. Her journal article 'Sub-Saharan African Immigrant Activists in Europe. Transcultural Capital and Transcultural Community Building' was included in a Reader on Migration: Policies, Practices, Activism, edited by Martin Bulmer and John Solomos, for Routledge in London. She wrote a policy note on Managing Asylum Seeking in Europe: How to Revise the Dublin II Convention, in the Notre Europe initiative Think Global, Act European. She convened a Workshop on Migrants and Roma in Greek Schools: a Relevant discussion at a time of Crisis? co-organized with the NGO Antigone and the Goethe Institute in Athens, on 20 December 2011; and two workshops on Circular Migration in Europe, one in Athens and the second in Rome: Circular Migrations in Europe, co organized with the National Research Council (CNR), in Rome on 6 June 2011 and Between Facts and Challenges of Circular Migration: The Case of Albania and Greece, in Athens on 12 April 2011. She was invited together with Dr. Ruby Gropas to present a paper on 'Migrants and the Nation in Southern Europe. Between Social Toleration and Political Exclusion', at a Conference organized by INED in Paris and the City University of New York and funded by the Russell Sage Foundation on 9-10 December 2011 in New York City. She was also invited to several events on cultural diversity in Greece organized by embassies and civil society organizations. Ioannis N. Grigoriadis, Research Fellow

In February 2011, Dr. Ioannis N. Grigoriadis presented a paper on minority rights in Turkey in a Workshop on EU-Turkey relations at the Free University Berlin. In April 2011 he participated in the ECPR Joint Sessions in St. Gallen, Switzerland with a paper on religion and foreign policy in Turkey. In May 2011 he participated in a conference on EU-Turkey relations at Yaşar University, Izmir. On 6 June 2011 he was awarded an honourable mention at the Sabanci International Research Award contest for his paper on Turkish foreign policy. In August 2011 he participated in the ECPR General Conference in Reykjavik, Iceland, presenting a paper on Iranian foreign policy and religion. On 24 October 2011, he passed the associate professorship exam organised by the Turkish Higher Education Council. In November 2011 he participated in the first ECFR Conference in Pristina. On 24 November 2011 he presented a paper on Greek foreign policy in the Middle East at ELIAMEP. Ruby Gropas, Research Fellow

Ruby Gropas was Visiting Fellow at Stanford University's Center on Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law (CDDRL) from January to August 2011. With funding from the Alexander S. Onassis Public Benefit Foundation she undertook research on the evolution of protest, contestation and opposition to EU integration and the creation of a 'borderless' Europe. She gave a lecture on May 5th at Stanford University on 'Protest in Europe' in the context of CDDRL's research seminar series. Ruby was also involved in the EU funded (FP7) IME research project on Identities and Modernities in Europe and participated in the project meeting in Helsinki in June 2010. She co-authored a chapter with Anna Triandafyllidou on "Greek Modernity and Europe: An Ambivalent Relationship" in 'Europe, Nations and Modernity' edited by Atsuko Ichijo and published by Palgrave, as well as two chapters on multicultural education and political rights of third country nationals in the EU in 'European Multiculturalisms' (edited by Triandafyllidou, Modood and Meer, Edinburg University Press: 2011). Other publications (co-authored with Anna Triandafyllidou) include 'Greek Education Policy and the Challenge of Migration: An 'Intercultural' View of Assimilation," in Race, Ethnicity and Education (REE), and "Migrants and Political Life in Greece: Between Political Patronage and the Search for Inclusion," in South European Society and Politics. On October 12th she gave a talk on 'Migration and the Greek Economy: Myths and Realities' at the Onassis Cultural Center (Στέγη Γραμμάτων και Τεχνών) in Athens and on December 9-10 she presented a paper on "Migrant Integration and the nation in southern Europe: between social toleration and political exclusion" at a conference organized by The Russell Sage Foundation and INED in New York on "Fear and anxiety over national identity: Contrasting North American and European experiences and public debates on immigrant and second generation integration."

Thanos Maroukis, Research Fellow

In January 2011 Thanos Maroukis, research fellow at ELIAMEP, presented a paper on the flows and entrapments of irregular migration in Greece at the Workshop "Migration and Crisis" organised by ELIAMEP and KRITIKI publishers in Athens, IANOS bookshop. As of January 2011 he has been coordinating the ELIAMEP research team working on the Greek, Cypriot and Bulgarian borders case studies within the context of the research project Treatment of Third Country Nationals at the EU's external borders, funded by the Fundamental Rights Agency of the European Commission. In April 2011 he organised a workshop entitled "Between facts and challenges of circular migration: the case of Albania and Greece" within the framework of the research project METOIKOS and presented together with Eda Gemi the case study on Albanian circular migrants in Greece. During the same month he presented a paper on Managing Irregular Migration, at the Conference "Migration, Effective Policy and Open Society", organised by OPEK Cyprus in Nicosia. In April 2011 Thanos Maroukis also concluded fieldwork on human smuggling into and out of Greece focusing on Asians (in particular, Afghans, Pakistanis and Bangladeshis) and published a paper entitled "Irregular migration and informal economy in Southern and Central-Eastern Europe: breaking the vicious cycle?" in the Journal International Migration. In June-July 2011 Thanos Maroukis co-wrote with Anna Triandafyllidou the book "Migrant Smuggling: Irregular Migration from Asia and Africa to Europe", to be published in April 2012 in the Migration, Minorities and Citizenship Series of Palgrave Macmillan Publishers. In June he presented a paper on the numbers and features of legal and undocumented migration in Greece at the Pan-European Conference on the Integration of Immigrants: "Good practices in the sectors of Health, Welfare and Social Security" in Athens. Finally, in December 2011 he published the ELIAMEP Briefing Note on 'Migration and the crisis in Greek society: the parameters of a coordinated departure'.

Evangelia Psychogiopoulou, Research Fellow

In 2011, Dr. Evangelia Psychogiopoulou, research fellow at ELIAMEP, was responsible for the coordination of the European research project MEDIADEM (European Media Policies Revisited: Valuing & Reclaiming Free and Independent Media in Contemporary Democratic Systems, grant agreement FP7-SSH-2009-A no. 244365) and for the conduct of the Greek case-study in the frame of this project. In this context, she has co-authored a report 'Does media policy promote media freedom and independence? The case of Greece' (http://www.mediadem.eliamep.gr/wp-content/uploads/2012/01/Greece.pdf); and a policy brief 'Policy implications of MEDIADEM, an EU-funded research project on media policies in 14 countries for media freedom and independence' (http://www.mediadem.eliamep.gr/wp-content/uploads/2011/03/D5.4.pdf). Further, she has authored a case note on Mesopotamia Broadcast and Roj TV, a judgment of the Court of Justice of the European Union (C-244/10 and C-245/10), which appeared in European Human Rights Cases. Also, she presented a paper on 'Media freedom and independence in Greece' at the workshop on Greek media policy, organised on 3 March 2011 in Athens by ELIAMEP; and a paper 'Domestic implementation of ECtHR judgments and the rights of immigrants and asylum seekers in Greece' at the workshop on Law, rights and social mobilisation in a multi-level European system, hosted by the International Institute for the Sociology of Law, Oñati, Spain, on 16-17 June 2011. Further, she has delivered a speech on 'Digital terrestrial television in Greece: Legal issues and challenges', which was organised by ELIAMEP and the Association of European Journalists (AEJ) - Greek Section in Athens on 30 June 2011. In September 2011, she participated in the FONI (Freedom of new ideas: Promotion of the freedom of expression, freedom of the press and freedom of speech





among the Moldovan younger generations) project, funded by the European Union's European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights, and delivered a lecture in Chisinau (Moldova) on 'Media policy and regulation for media freedom and independence'.

Dimitri A. Sotiropoulos, Stavros Costopoulos Research Fellow

On 1-3 February 2011 Dimitri travelled to Prishtina (Kosovo) where he met with Kosovar journalists in order to prepare ELIAMEP's seminar on the role of the media in conflict resolution, which was scheduled for March 2011. On 9 February 2011 Dimitri presented a paper at the Centre of Political Studies (Panteion University, Athens) on the advantages and weaknesses of historical institutionalism as a theoretical framework for research in politics. On 14-17 February he and Dr. George Tzogopoulos travelled to Belgrade. They met with Serb journalists interested in participating in the aforementioned seminar and with Serb political scientists at the University of Belgrade. Dimitri had also been invited by Belgrade's Centre for Political Excellence to give a public lecture on the comparative assessment of democratization in the post-communist Balkans. The event took place on 16 February in the Hellenic Foundation of Culture, in Belgrade.

On 9-11 March Dimitri coordinated as seminar on the role of the mass media in the conflict between Serbs and Kosovars over Kosovo. The seminar was funded by the European Union and was organized by Dimitri and Dr. George Tzogopoulos. A report on this seminar has already been uploaded in ELIAMEP's website. On 24 March Dimitri coordinated a book launch at ELIAMEP. The book was Kerem Oktem's, *Angry Nation*, Zed Books, London 2011. Dr. Oktem gave a presentation of his work to ELIAMEP researchers. In April Dimitri along with two other ELIAMEP researchers (Chara Kouki, Christina Moschaklaidi) worked on a project proposal suggested by Serb journalists from Novi Sad. The project proposal was on civic education of young pupils from Serbia, Montenegro and Kosovo and was submitted to the European Commission. The proposal won a grant and the project will take place in the winter of 2012-2013. On 26-28 May Dimitri participated in a conference at Oxford's St. Antony's College on the crisis in Greece and presented a paper on reforms in the Greek educational system.

On 16-18 June he participated in the concluding conference of the EU funded integrated project "Reconciling Work and Welfare" (RECOWE). The conference took place in Brussels and Dimitri presented a paper on the Europeanization of Greek welfare policies over 1980-2010. The paper was eventually published in the collected volume titled *The EU and the Domestic Politics of Welfare State Reforms. Europa, Europae*, edited by Paolo Graziano, Sophie Jacquot and Bruno Palier, Palgrave, London, 2011. On 7-10 July Dimitri participated in ELIAMEP's annual European Seminar which took place on Poros island and focused on politics and policy choices in the EU under crisis. On 24-27 August, Dimitri travelled to Reykjavik in order to participate in the General Conference of the European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR). He presented a paper on the crisis in Greece, focusing on the political system level causes of the crisis.

From January to July 2011 Dimitri published four articles in the Greek Sunday newspaper *To Vima tis Kyriakis*, on various topics of current Greek affairs. In the same period he was the scientific coordinator of ELIAMEP's public events titled 'ELIAMEP debates'. These were panel discussions on current public policy issues and took place in front of an audience in Athens.

Throughout the first 9 months of 2011 Dimitri worked as coordinator of a team of social scientists and historians, responsible to reform the school curricula of the social science and history subjects. In June 2011 the team, which had been entrusted with this task by the Ministry of Education and the Paedagogical Institute

in 2010, delivered a comprehensive new school curriculum for the teaching of civic education, home economics and history in Greek primary and junior-high schools. For this reason, Dimitri prepared and delivered a paper on the new school curricula in a meeting with school principals and Ministry of Education officials on 17 September in Athens. He also presented the results of the same project to high school teachers on 22 October in Piraeus.

On 31 October-2 November Dimitri participated along with Dr. Yannis Armakolas in a conference in Prishtina on the European future of Kosovo. Finally, in November and December 2011, Dimitri travelled to Lisbon and Oporto in order to participate in the external evaluation of three departments of politics and international relations of Portuguese Universities.

Effie Fokas, Marie Curie Intra-European Fellow

2011 has been a year of data analysis for the research conducted in Bulgaria and Romania at the end of 2010, as well as preparation for the research to be conducted in the Greek and Russian cases in 2012. Further, Dr. Fokas completed a book chapter on Greek Orthodoxy in America (as an important comparison with Orthodoxy in majority contexts, which is the focus of the PLUREL project), and began work on a draft journal article examining Western European influence on secularization and pluralism in majority Orthodox contexts. From March to September Dr. Fokas was on maternity leave.

Anna Kandyla, Junior Research Fellow

In March 2011, Anna Kandyla at the workshop on 'Greek media policy', organised by the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP). In June 2011 she was responsible for the organisation of the workshop on 'Media policies & regulation for media freedom & independence', which was held under the framework of the MEDIADEM project (European Media Policies Revisited: Valuing & Reclaiming Free and Independent Media in Contemporary Democratic Systems) by the Hellenic Foundation for European and Foreign Policy (ELIAMEP) in cooperation with the Association of European Journalists (AEJ) - Greek Section. In December 2011 Anna, together with Dr. Evangelia Psychogiopoulou and Dr. Dia Anagnostou, published a report on the policy processes and the regulatory tools that have a bearing on the development of free and independent media in Greece, entitled 'Case study report - Does media policy promote media freedom and independence? The case of Greece'.

Marina Nikolova, Junior Research Fellow

In 2011, Marina Nikolova, Junior Researcher at ELIAMEP, assisted the national coordinator for Greece for the European Web Site on Integration, Prof. Anna Triandafyllidou. The EU integration web site development project is coordinated by the Migration Policy Group (MPG) in Brussels. In March 2011, Marina Nikolova attended the MIPEXIII data mining workshop with Thomas Huddleston (MPG) and Miltos Pavlou (i-Red), held at the British Council, Athens. In October 2011, the report "Migrants in an irregular situation: access to healthcare in 10 European Union Member States" was published by the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) - the field research for the report in Greece was conducted by Marina Nikolova. From November 2011, Marina Nikolova participates in the project Treatment of third country nationals at EU's external borders, commissioned by the European Union Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) and coordinated by the International Centre for Migration Policy Development (ICMPD).

Between January and August 2011, interviews were conducted with a range of high-ranking officers in the UK and Greece experienced in international police collaboration. Broader research findings from the SEC POL TRANSFER project were presented at international academic conferences and prepared for publication. Invited commentaries on contemporary socio-political upheavals in Greece were also provided during this timeframe to news programmes of international media outlets, including the BBC and Al Jazeera.


