Maritime challenges for the EU

Programme

Concept Note

Collectively, the EU has the largest merchant marine fleet in the world. Its combined naval capabilities place it in the second tier of 'blue water' navies, well below the US but at the same level as Russia and China. Also, as mentioned in the recent Joint Communication to the European Parliament and the Council, 'some 90% of the EU's external trade and 40% of its internal trade is transported by sea. The EU is the 3rd largest importer and the 5th global producer of fisheries and aquaculture. More than 400 million passengers pass through EU ports each year'. The EU depends on open, safe seas and oceans for a broad range of activities and the need to safeguard them against a wide array of maritime threats and risks was underlined by the European Council in December 2013. The Union's approach to maritime security will be strategic and cross-sectorial with a focus on building upon and strengthening existing achievements, rather than creating new structures.

The workshop will focus on the maritime security interests of the EU: threats such as piracy, the protection of the EU global supply chain, illegal migration and other illegal activities (transnational organised crime, unauthorised fishing and environmental pollution), terrorism, over-exploitation of energy resources, etc.).

The main geographical focus will be on the Mediterranean Sea and adjoining maritime regions followed by a reflection on the basic principles of an EU maritime security strategy.

The goal of the workshop is to make a contribution towards ensuring consistency with existing EU policies and making the best use of existing capabilities at both national and European level, with an emphasis on maritime awareness, surveillance and information-sharing as well as risk management, protection of critical maritime infrastructures and crisis response.
