Irregular migration: a puzzle that defies policy

- Faster transport, constantly connected
- Are they so poor in their own countries?
 Inequality, relative deprivation, hope
- How is it that policies cannot control migration?
 - Strong motivations
 - Intermediate actors
 - Agency









Turning the concept upside down: Beyond irregularity

- Mixed motivations rather than mixed flows.
- The state's viewpoint vs the migrant's perspective
- -A closer look on:
 - Intermediate Actors employers, smugglers, NGOs, travel/employment agents, social workers, ethnic networks
 - The power of information









The case of Greece: Irregular migration and asylum seeking pathways – 5 countries of origin Albania Ukraine, Georgia Pakistan, Afghanistan Methodology: Desk research, Interviews with stakeholders, migrants in GR and in transit or at origin









Before the journey:

- Economic motivations pervasive
- Insecurity as a catalyst
- More or less realistic hopes diffuse or specific knowledge
- Finding contacts is easy / networks though differ









Turning Plans to Action

- Aspiration and capability (mobilise resources)
- Dealing with risk and uncertainty
- Policies as hurdles to overcome
- The "law in the mind"
- Mobilising capital: at home, abroad, on the road









Now that I am here... information is crucial

- The impact of internal fencing: controls in public places and dealing with everyday ris
- Return and/or detention (Afgh, Pak)
- Is legal status within reach? Assessing one's chances and making choices (Ukr, Geo)
- Navigating policies to secure a job (Alb)









Returning on Moving on: Caught in a Trap?

- Undocumented status: Life... interrupted
 - The experience of Afghans and Pakistanis
 - The experience of Ukrainians and Georgians

Defying the policy, still planning to move on: A matter of resources – is irregular migration a class matter?









Concluding Remarks: Focus on the migrant not the policy (codification system)

- Information is crucial but needs to be tailored to the needs of the target population and reach them through credible channels.
- General control or management policies are not effective. They increase costs, risks and divert flows rather than achieve sustainable results.
