Concept Note

This conference aims to bring together a number of leading thinkers and policy makers from across Europe and beyond to discuss informally and in depth the security problems in the Mediterranean. The exercise will focus on (a) the conflict in Syria (b) the situation in Iraq (including the Kurdish issue, which would be also examined as a regional issue) (c) The Israeli-Palestinian conflict (d) the threat of ISIS/jihadist terrorism and (e) population movements, including issues such as mobility, refugee & asylum policies, and organized crime. Three papers will be commissioned in advance to experts with a deep knowledge of the region. Each expert will be asked to present one scenario [(i) pessimistic/catastrophic (ii) medium/undesired and (iii) optimistic/desired followed by recommendations for stakeholders on how to prevent scenarios (i) & (ii) and increase the likelihood of scenario (iii)]. Those papers will be sent well in advance to all workshop participants. After extensive debate during the workshop (which will be a brainstorming exercise, with very few formal presentations), a final paper would be drafted, incorporating all three scenarios and related policy recommendations. The paper will be widely disseminated among relevant policymakers and the academic community.
