The EU is at a critical juncture one year after Russia's invasion of Ukraine. In addition to economic difficulties stemming from spiraling inflation, the disengagement from Russia's energy and a return of trade protectionism, there is also the challenge posed by growing strategic competition between major powers. In this changing global order, the EU seeks to advance both deepening and widening, and to equip itself with the necessary tools to realise its ambition to remain relevant in a more "geopolitical" world.

In this context, Enlargement Policy has returned to the centre of debates on the EU's future. Despite being described as one of the EU's most successful policies, Enlargement is now in need of a renewed, realistic and honest approach, as the relationship with the Western Balkan region attests. In June 2022 the EU leaders granted Ukraine and Moldova the status of candidate countries and the European perspective to Georgia. That decision marked an unprecedented shift in the Enlargement Policy and created an opportunity to rethink and revitalise a complex and transformative process. Since then, a number of proposals have emerged to relaunch the enlargement process, mostly to restore the incentive power of accession prospects and also for the EU's own internal reforms.

On the eve of the Spanish Presidency of the Council of the European Union (July-December 2023), *Política Exterior* journal, in collaboration with the State Secretariat for the European Union-Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs, EU and Cooperation and University of Alcalá, brings together a group of experts from EU member states and candidate countries to discuss the new geopolitical context of enlargement, the different existing proposals to promote a profoundly transformative policy and the challenges it implies for each of the countries and for the European Union as a whole.
